

Literacy - Listening, Talking, Reading and Writing

As requested by the class, this term we will take the time to revise a number of different areas of writing, beginning with journalism. Reading in class will centre around Climate Action, with tasks that allow us to both consolidate key skills whilst also unleashing our creativity with design and digital challenges. As we learn a range of songs in January for Scots night, we will look to build upon our articulation, volume and pronunciation.

Maths and Numeracy

This term we will be learning about co-ordinates and grid references. This will build upon our existing knowledge of angle, direction, time and measurement. We will also be taking the time to revise key mental agility skills through playful activities and lots of opportunity for over learning. The class have been working productively and responsibly in groups of their choosing and we look to continue with this for the remainder of term 2. Maths homework will continue to be set weekly. The tasks have a lot of flexibility and the expectation is no more than 10 mins per evening (where possible).

Other Curricular Areas

This term, Wednesdays will be Marvel themed as we battle 'The Liquid Lord.' We will also be learning about Natural Disasters, showcasing our knowledge in our Minecraft museum. There will also be weekly opportunities for self-led history sessions looking to develop our autonomy.

Health & Wellbeing

The class have worked together to create their own class charter that links to our school values and acts as a daily reference to the positive behaviours and attitudes we hope to see in and out of the classroom. We continue to venture outside twice a day to play collaborative games that foster resilience, understanding and belonging.

Home Learning

As with the previous term, in our bid to develop enthusiastic readers, we are strongly encouraging Primary 7 to be reading for at least twenty minutes every day. The class have, at their request, been given homework jotters so they can write one sentence daily that summarises what they have read. Maths homework is also set weekly and is due on a Thursday.

Ethos & Wider Life of the School

We are delighted to say that every pupil in P7 has been awarded with a Prefect badge. The class are also involved in fundraising for camp, acting as playground helpers and leading in areas like sport, pupil council and the choir. Football training will recommence at the start of February and pupils in P7 have the opportunity to use the new Astro pitch on Tuesday and Thursday lunchtimes.
